Additional Notes:

- *Period Covered: The period covered by any statement begins on the day after the closing date of the last statement filed or January 1 if no previous statement has been filed.
- **Deadlines: Due to the date of the August 27 Special Primary Election, the first pre-election statement for the August 27 Special Primary Election and the semi-annual statement may be combined.
- Odd Year Report: File by April 30, 2019 if contributions totaling \$10,000 or more are made to committees controlled by *elected* state officers between January 1 and March 31, 2019 and by October 31 if contributions totaling \$10,000 or more are made to committees controlled by *elected* state officers between June 1 and September 30, 2019.
- Deadline Extensions: Deadlines are extended when they fall on a Saturday, Sunday, or an official state holiday. This extension does not apply to a 24-Hour/10-Day Contribution Report (Form 497) that is due the weekend before the election, and this extension never applies to any 24-Hour/10-Day Independent Expenditure Report (Form 496). Such reports must be filed within 24 hours, regardless of the day of the week.
- **E-Filer:** A state committee that has received contributions or made expenditures totaling \$25,000 or more.

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- Forms 496 and 497: Payments for member communications are reportable within 24 hours if the member communication would otherwise be considered a contribution or independent expenditure, and the payments are made during the election cycle.
- Forms 450 and 460: All state committees, including e-filers, must also file paper reports. Paper reports may be filed by first class mail unless otherwise noted.
- Penalties: Failure to file a statement on time subjects a committee to a fine of \$10 per day on both the paper and the e-filed version (i.e., \$20 per day for a late e-filed Form 460). Failure to file a statement could result in an enforcement penalty of \$5,000 per violation.
- State Contribution Limits: Refer to the contribution limits chart on the FPPC website.
- Public Documents: All forms are public documents.
